Our Co-Curricular Activity (CCA) Storytelling Program for Nursery, LKG, and UKG students sparked exciting changes in their young lives.

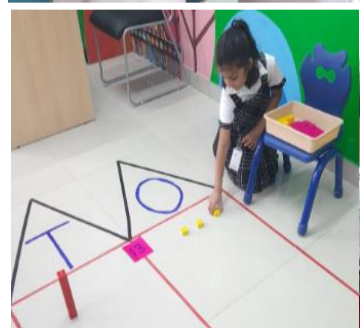
